## BIG IDEA

Is your heart tuned to heaven's frequency? Hearing the Word of God doesn't start with your ears, it starts with your heart. Pastor Daniel explains the four ways that our hearts might receive the Word of God. He uses a parable of Jesus to encourage us to evaluate where our hearts may be. Then he gives us practical steps for how to develop and protect a heart that is prepared to produce a bountiful harvest.

## TALK IT OVER

Choose questions that keep the discussion moving. No need to discuss every question.

- How can you better hear the voice of God and differentiate that from the voice of the enemy?
- The Unsubmitted Heart:
  - What do you protect? Why?
  - Who or what has the final word in your life? Why is it difficult to live with God as the authority in your life?
- The Immature Heart:
  - What do you invest your time in? What is the result?
  - Describe a mature Christian. How long does it take to become a mature Christian? Why?
- The Undisciplined Heart:
  - When have you allowed worries, riches, or pleasures to choke out the Word of God in your life?
  - How do we distinguish between right and wrong thoughts? How do we control our thoughts and stop those that are inappropriate?
- The Prepared Heart:
  - What are you prepared for? Why?
  - What are the benefits of listening to and applying God's Word?

## APPLICATION IDEAS

- Over the next week, focus on removing distractions to hear and retain the Word of God.

## PRAYER FOCUS
