BIG IDEA

From an early age, New York Times #1 bestselling author, John C. Maxwell, believed Jesus changed his life so he could help others change their lives. In today's message, he explains that mass movements begin with a few positive change agents. People change when they hurt enough that they must change, see enough that they are inspired to change, learn enough that they want to change, and receive enough that they are able to change. You can encourage positive change in your world by living your values and valuing others.

TALK IT OVER

Choose questions that keep the discussion moving. No need to discuss every question.

- 2 Corinthians 5:17 says when we follow Jesus, we become a new creation. What are some ways you changed when you met Jesus?
- What do you value? Why? Who is difficult for you to value? How can you learn to value them?
- What do you need to surrender to God to make room to help others?
- What are you willing to share with others? What are you unwilling to share? Why?
- What makes a person a positive change agent? What challenges does a positive change agent face?
- How do our values affect our ability to be influential with others?

APPLICATION IDEAS

- As you solidify your plans for Serve Day, discuss ways to add value to people beyond the basic plan for the project.
