### BIG IDEA

The next generation is crying out for help. Dakari Rollins, Spotsylvania Campus Youth Director, shows us that God is concerned about people coming to Him. We need to help the next generation through our prayers and by telling them and showing them who God is. If we don't, who will?

### TALK IT OVER

Choose questions that keep the discussion moving. No need to discuss every question.

- Describe a time when you felt a desire to help someone else but didn't because you were distracted.
- What was God's purpose for sending Jesus? What is God's greatest concern?
- How can we concern ourselves about the next generation? How can we be sure that our prayers for them are heard by God?
- How can we best approach the next generation with the Good News of Jesus? What "stones of remembrance" could we put in place for future generations?
- How does the way we live our lives impact the decisions of the next generation regarding God?
- What are the consequences when we are distracted from being a positive impact on the next generation? How do we overcome distractions?

### APPLICATION IDEAS

- Pray for the next generation. Share your testimony about what God can do and who He is. Show the next generation a life that models what you believe and be a part of the mission to help them.

### PRAYER FOCUS

At Lifepoint, we pray until something happens. Make time in every group meeting to pray for one another and the larger matters of concern to your group.

- Pray for the next generation and what your next step needs to be to share who God is with them.

### LEADER TIPS
