BIG IDEA

Have you decided to make a change in your life only to realize it takes significantly more energy and fortitude than you originally thought? In today's sermon, Pastor Daniel continues with last Sunday's study of the Gardener, the Vine, and the branches found in John 15. Specifically, he teaches us about how to release the idea of control we have over our lives and to allow God to use us as extensions of Himself in this world by remaining connected to Him.

 Take a step of faith this week and draw nearer to God. Journal each day about how you felt throughout the day. How was your attitude towards your day/life this week after consistently and intentionally drawing near to God?

PRAYER FOCUS
