

APRIL 6, 2025 LET THE RIVER RUN Discussion Guide

SERMON SUMMARY

We may try to retain control over our plans, but living a supernatural life requires a different approach. Charlotte Gambill from Church of the Highlands illustrates that such a life operates at a different pace and demands processes that often push us beyond our comfort zones. Living a supernatural life involves having a plan based on faith rather than opting for safety. Embrace the change to experience all that God has planned for you.

SCRIPTURES USED IN THE MESSAGE

- Amos 9:13-15
- Luke 5:37-38
- Proverbs 3:5-6
- Ezekiel 47:1-12

TALK IT OVER

Choose questions that keep the discussion moving. No need to discuss every question.

- Why is it better to feel you have no control when God is making changes in your life than to be in control? How can you know your plans are faith-based instead of safe plans?
- Describe a time when your plans were based on faith rather than your feelings and desire to be in control.
- What plans have you made to play it safe that you now need to change by stepping out in faith?
- Read Luke 5:37-38. Why do you need new wineskins for new wine? How does this apply to our ability to live a supernatural life?
- What are you holding on to or avoiding that is impeding your spiritual progress?
- Read Ezekial 47:1-12. What does the river represent?

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- Where are you standing in the river? Is your daily life exemplifying being in over your head (fully saturated) or ankle/knee deep (merely hydrated)?
- What areas of your life are you living hydrated instead of saturated?

APPLICATION IDEAS

• For those areas of your life that you need to change from living hydrated to saturated, what are the next steps you are going to take to make the necessary change(s)?

GO DEEPER

Additional ideas for a deeper study of the sermon topic.

• Find people in the Bible who followed God in faith and lived an out of control, supernatural life. You can start with Abraham, Noah, and David. What supernatural things did they experience?

PRAYER FOCUS
