SERMON SUMMARY

1 Timothy 3:1-7 provides an essential process for selecting leaders, which is especially important when appointing pastoral leaders. Pastor Daniel explains the biblical process for selecting leaders in the Kingdom of God, emphasizing its importance as new co-pastors were chosen to guide Lifepoint Church forward. Leaders are appointed primarily through prayer and must demonstrate proven character and maturity. The Holy Spirit plays a key role and authenticates the selection through the laying on of hands.
